Brower Pet FAQs

Will pets be allowed at Brower Park?

Yes, beginning with the 2018 camping season, pets will be allowed at Brower Park. (Pets allowed are domesticated dogs, cats and small birds in cages. The park staff may allow a pet not specifically listed if it is similar to a dog or cat.)

Are there rules pertaining to pets?

Yes, any pet owner will be required to follow the rules outlined in Section 23 of the Mecosta County Park Commission Rules and Regulations document.

Do dogs have to be on a leash?

Yes; when removed from the campsite a dog must be on 6-foot or shorter leash.

What about when the pet is on the campsite?

A pet at a campsite must always be accompanied by its owner. The pet may be placed on a tie-out, if the rope doesn't extend past the boundaries of the site. Portable crates are also acceptable for containing a pet on a campsite.

Are dog owners required to clean up after their pets?

Yes! Any person walking their pet must have a device with them to pick up the pet's waste. Additionally, pet clean-up stations will be placed strategically throughout the park with small waste bags and garbage cans available.


Are there any areas of the campground where pets are not allowed?


Pets are not allowed in beach areas, pavilions, park buildings or rental cabins.

What happens if the dog is aggressive, left alone or constantly barking?

The pet and owner may be subject to immediate eviction. Section 23 of the rules has stipulations in place for these types of situations:

• Section 23 states failure to comply with the rules can result in remedy up to and including immediate eviction of the pet and owner.
